



## **A Note From Pastor Kendall:**

Praise the God of Snow and Ice

Psalm 147:1, 15-18

"Praise the LORD. How good it is to sing praises to our God, how pleasant and fitting to praise him. He sends his command to the earth; his word runs swiftly. He spreads the snow like wool and scatters the frost like ashes. He hurls down his hail like pebbles. Who can withstand his icy blast? He sends his word and melts them; he stirs up his breezes, and the waters flow."

I always say I love each season for its own special reasons. In the winter, I truly love the snow. I love how pretty it is when it's falling, how the morning is so still and hushed and undisturbed with the fresh snow blanket covering the ground. I love playing in the snow with the kids. I don't even mind clearing the driveway and sidewalk. It can be hard work, but there's something exciting and rewarding about getting out there and taking care of it. But sometimes a person can have enough of a good thing. After getting a foot and half of snow, I didn't really want to hear the forecast of another possible storm on the way, especially since it was scheduled for a Sunday yet again! (As of this writing it looks like it's going to miss us.) We may love the snow for different reasons. For some of us it means great conditions for fun like snowmobiling, hitting the slopes or sledding. For others it means extra work and much needed income. But that also means more nights away from your cozy bed and time with your family. For others it might mean greater isolation because it's hard to get out in the bad weather. Personally, the snow is fun, but I don't mind thinking about the warmth of Spring.

Regardless of how we feel about the snow and icy air, Psalm 147 invites us to praise the Lord as the one who sends all kinds of weather our way. He sends his commands upon his created world and his word rushes to be fulfilled on earth.

The snow that falls is the hand of God spreading it over our land. The frost in the morning is like the Lord scattering ashes. He throws down the hail, he breathes out the icy wind chill, he also sends his word to melt it all away and usher in the warm springtime. He is the Divine Master of all creation, and yet he still cares about each and every one of us. What a wonderful thing to celebrate! And if God cares about us, and it the one responsible for what happens in all of creation, we can trust that no matter what we face on a day-to-day basis--the joys, the disappointments, the griefs, longings--it's all in the hands of our Divine Master. So whether we feel the newness of life right now, or feeling stuck in life, we can say, how good it is to sing praises to our God. Praise the Lord!



### **December Update from Steven and Karissa Koopmans**

#### ***Wai'aha.***

December has been a heavy mix of joy and some sad goodbyes.

The students absolutely love Christmas and went all out decorating their classrooms.

One long-standing tradition at the school—even from when I was a student here—is the annual Christmas program put on by the entire school, K–11, for families and the community. The students did an amazing job, and the Gospel message was clearly shared. There were Christmas hula dances, a skit, and a beautiful presentation by the K–2 students as they told the story of Jesus' birth, referring to Him as the “Light” while shining flashlights. A student also performed a saxophone solo; his neighbors, who are not believers, attended because they had heard him practicing. Several additional dance pieces rounded out the evening. It was a special time.

Steve and I also said goodbye to our dear friends from Finland, Timi and Liina, who are heading back with their boys and will not be returning next semester. This was a difficult goodbye for us, especially as I am losing my running partner.

We flew to New Jersey for Christmas so we could meet our nephew, Mark. Spending time with family and reconnecting with good friends has been such a gift, and it has been really refreshing.

Please pray for a good engineering job that fits Steve's interests as well as a good teaching job for Karissa.

Over the past couple of months, we have carefully considered each of our options. Staying in Hawaii would truly be wonderful—we feel settled after two moves, changes in vehicles, and we love our community here. At the same time, we have felt a great sense of peace when we think about moving back to the mainland.
