## A Note From Pastor Kendall: A Taste of the Kingdom

I'm ready for Spring. Winter was fun while it lasted but I'm over it now. I like snow, colder temperatures, the lakes freezing over, and recently I found out I really like skiing, but I'm ready for Spring and warmer weather. The end of February and early March often bring some phantom Spring days. We recently had a bitter cold front, then a few days where the temperatures got into the forties and fifties. With the sun shining, it might as well have been seventy degrees. On one of those days, I was playing outside with the kids and we were so warm there was no need for coats or sweatshirts. It was gloriously refreshing. It filled my soul with joy and hope for those Spring days where the sun shines, the robins return, the days are longer, and the early flowers blossom.

Now, of course I know that these few warm days don't mean Spring has officially arrived. In New Jersey, I know this like the "false Spring". Then it will go back to feeling like winter. There's a good chance we get more snow in March. Then gradually we'll get some more days where it feels like Spring, then another cold front before Spring REALLY arrives. Of course with Spring's arrival will bring rain and the mud season until everything dries up. But it still feels really good and reminds me of the joy of what's to come.

It got me thinking about the Kingdom of God. When Jesus came to earth and began his ministry, he announced the kingdom of God had come!

Luke 17:20-21 says, Once, on being asked by the Pharisees when the kingdom of God would come, Jesus replied, "The coming of the kingdom of God is not something that can be observed, nor will people say, 'Here it is,' or 'There it is,' because the kingdom of God is in your midst."

We talk about the kingdom of God in terms of the "already and the not-yet". The Kingdom of God is already in our midst because of the work of Jesus and his Spirit living within us. It is just not yet complete. What an incredible reality to think about--that God's kingdom is already here! Yet we look at our world and we see the mess and chaos. There are still wars being raged, innocent people being taken advantage of, tragedy and disease still stealing the days of our loved ones. There is still corruption of our hearts and corruption in our world. But the kingdom is coming. In fact, it has already arrived. Like those early Spring days, we already get a chance to taste it and see it. We see the kingdom of God when the church really acts like the church. We see it in the Word of God speaking life to our hearts. We see it in a newborn baby or the genuine unbridled joy of a child. We see it when a grieving person can still find joy and laughter. We see it when the hurting experience healing in body and soul. People of God, it may not always feel like it, but the Kingdom of God has come, and soon we will see the finished product. In the meantime, let's keep our eyes open to celebrate the kingdom of God at work as a taste of what is yet to come.
